Some things to ponder as we approach World Communion Sunday on October 5th.

There have been incredible recent developments in the Christian world, among them being the explosive growth of churches south of the border and the fact there will soon be more Christians in the southern hemisphere than in the northern. Experts are still trying to project the impact that will have.

At the same time the world has gotten much smaller. With the dramatic developments in communications and information technologies, with so many companies working internationally, with countries in various regions joining together in trade and development agreements, the world has become so much more interdependent.

At any given time it is likely that someone from Wayside is traveling internationally. We regularly have people on business in various places in the Far East, we have soldiers on duty in the Middle East, we have students doing study time in Europe, a number of our Sudanese friends have recently visited back home, we have Canadian members, and even my own kids have visited in Latin America.

World Communion Sunday has taken on new relevancy and depth of meaning in a world where globalization has become a fact. While that has resulted in many positive developments, it has too often undermined peace and justice and generated new fears that divide the people's of God's earth. When we gather at the Table on October 5th let us celebrate our oneness in Christ, the Prince of Peace, remembering that we are in the midst of the world he has called us to serve, a world filled with wonders but in ever more desperate needs of God's shalom.

Let's gather at the Table on October 5th to give thanks and remember.

See you in church.

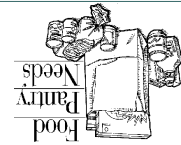

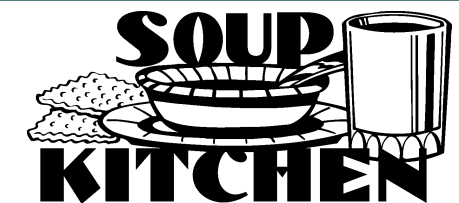

BUDGET CONCERNS

Once again as we approach the end of the year our budget reflects the stresses and strains of a growing church. The Budget Committee, as well as the Trustees and Session, has been keeping a close eye on things and offers a few thoughts for all of us:

1. Keep your pledge payments as up-to-date as possible.
2. Consider proportionate giving the next time you make a pledge. Take a moment to actually calculate the percentage of your giving and, if it's not a tithe (10%), formulate a plan of incremental increases that will bring you closer to that goal.
3. If it's possible, include a little extra in your weekly envelope. Even just \$5 a week more would be a great help.

WAYSIDE WORK CREW TO THE GULF COAST

The fifth Wayside work crew being sent to the Gulf Coast to assist with the ongoing relief efforts will depart on Sunday, October 26th and return to Erie the following Saturday, November 1st. In all likelihood the group will be working in the Pearlinton, Mississippi area where the four previous Wayside teams have volunteered their services, though there is a possibility that our team could be relocated to the Houma, Louisiana volunteer village where the recent Hurricane Gustav did major damage. The son of two musicians, Erik Meyer was born in Milwaukee, WI, but was raised in [Collingswood, NJ](#). He began his musical studies on piano at the age of five. When he was thirteen, he attended an [American Guild of Organists \(AGO\)](#) sponsored pipe organ encounter in Philadelphia. He then made the switch from piano to organ, playing in two local churches and studying under Lutheran pastor, organist, and composer J. Bert Carlson.

Erik earned a BM and MM in organ performance from the [Peabody Conservatory of Music](#), Baltimore, where he studied with [Donald Sutherland](#). Besides organ study, his Peabody years were spent performing with the student orchestras and in operas, singing in the Peabody Chamber Singers, premiering works by student composers, designing the organ studio website, teaching ear-training classes, and playing chamber music. Recently he has studied with [Todd Wilson](#).

His recitals have been throughout the American East, Germany and England with solos and duo with his flutist wife, Anna. Major performance venues include Canterbury Cathedral, UK; Chichester Cathedral, UK; Christ Church Cathedral, Cincinnati OH; Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, Camden NJ; National City Christian Church, Washington DC; Penn State University, Behrend Campus; St. Peter Cathedral, Erie, PA; The Episcopal Cathedral of St. Paul, Erie, Pa.

Erik has participated in and won a number of organ and composition competitions, the most recent being the highly competitive NYACOP, sponsored by the AGO. He has performed numerous solo recitals in the American east, and is a member of the Erie AGO and the [ALCM](#).

Among his Church positions have been the Assistant Chapel Organist, U. S. Naval Academy, Annapolis, MD; Director of Music, [Holy Cross Lutheran Church](#), Greenbelt, MD; and currently, Cantor, [Luther Memorial Church](#), Erie, PA, where he also serves as Artistic Director of the [Luther Memorial Concert Series](#).

In the fall of 2007, Erik was appointed to the adjunct faculty at Mercyhurst College, Erie, where he teaches organ and music theory. One of his choral compositions is published by [Augsburg Fortress](#).

WORSHIP IN OCTOBER

Our worship during the month of October begins with World Communion Sunday, perhaps the best opportunity we have throughout the year to celebrate our Christian unity with brothers and sisters around the world. At the very end of the month we will witness to the church triumphant and give thanks for all those Waysiders who have completed this life and begun a new one during the past twelve months.

October 5th **World Communion Sunday**

Text – Matthew 21:33-46

Title – “Whose Vineyard Is It?”

The wisdom in Jesus’ parable of the tenants can be interpreted as more sobering than joyful, but it depends on how we read and hear these words. There is certainly a challenge issued, one that we dare not deny. On this World Communion Sunday, we remember who our fellow workers are and whose vineyard it is in which we work.

October 12th

Text – Exodus 32:1-14

Title – “Two Brothers”

During the forty years that the Hebrew people wandered in the wilderness following the exodus from Egypt, life was tough. There were problems galore. Moses and Aaron held the top leadership positions. Even though they were brothers, their respective reaction to the challenges were as different as day and night. They offer us a good case study of a Christian response to a difficult situation.

October 19th Text - Mark 12:28-34a

Title - “What’s It All About?”

Dr. Marcus Borg, our Convocation speaker, will preach at both services. Dr. Borg is an internationally renowned Bible scholar, author of fourteen books, and professor of Religion and Culture in the Philosophy Department at Oregon State University. He has a wonderful way of bringing the Scriptures to life.

October 26th

Text – Matthew 22:34 - 46

Title – “Debating Jesus”

Logical faith is a contradiction. In his debate with the Pharisees, Jesus moves them out of their 1-2-3 religion into the mystery of faith. Or at least he offers a methodology. Dr. Borg offered images for moving from logic to wonder. This is a good week to remember and reflect.
