

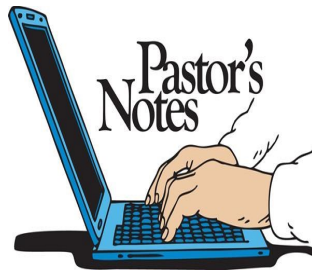

The grace and peace of Jesus Christ be with you all!

In the month of May we transition to in-person worship in our sanctuary at 11:00 AM on May 23, Pentecost Sunday. On that day an earlier service outdoors will take place service at 9:00 AM. In-person, indoor worship in the sanctuary will continue from then on. Online worship will also continue each week. It is important that each person decide their own comfort level with being in-person as we journey through the pandemic. It is a matter of personal decision and each person is free and beloved within this fellowship.

The Session has approved these procedures for in-person worship:

Make known your intention – By Thursday each week, register online (www.wayside-erie.org) or call Wayside (814-833-7653). This will help with plans to maintain social distancing and have worship materials in place. Persons arriving without registering will **not** be turned away, but your help in planning is requested.

Social Distancing is required and masks must be worn at all times in the building. Mask wearing remains mandatory regardless of vaccination status. Please don't put a pastor or usher in the awkward position of having to turn away anyone who might object to wearing a mask.

Consider Your Risk Factors. *Persons 65+, and those with compromised immune systems and other health risks should exercise caution. *Many have received their vaccinations and can take that into account. *If you have symptoms related to COVID-19 or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, please refrain from attending. *If you are unsure about attending due to health concerns, consult your healthcare provider.

Hugging, hand-shaking and personal contact is strongly discouraged.

Lobby doors will remain closed until 30 minutes before worship.

The sanctuary, lobby, and restrooms are treated by bipolar ionization airflow filtration to mitigate possible virus transmission. Restrooms will be open. Please be courteous to permit distancing.

Ushers will coordinate your entry and seating. Sit only in the designated seating areas. Once seated, remain at your seat. Visit only with those near you. Worship materials will be at your seat. An offering basket will be near the entry to the sanctuary.

No nursery care will be provided until further notice. Children are welcome in worship!

Some parts of worship will be spoken responses. Until further notice there will be no congregational singing.

At the conclusion of worship, ushers will dismiss worshipers. Take all personal items. Return will only be permitted after all worshipers have departed.

Fellowship time is encouraged outdoors. Please do not congregate in the lobby. Refreshments may be available outside.

As CDC and local guidelines change, vaccinations increase, and more knowledge is gained, these procedures will change. Your patient cooperation is appreciated.

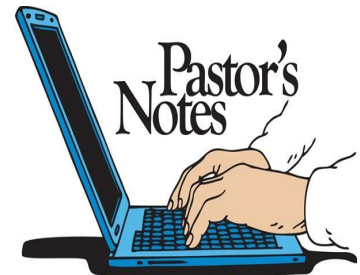

As also stated, online worship will continue. During the Summer, each Second Sunday, (June 13, July 11 and August 8) the service will be held outdoors.

BUDGET BYTES from the Budget Committee

April showers bring May flowers and let's call those flowers pink in color, because Karen, our Financial Secretary, is "tickled pink," according to her latest report. Our revenues year-to-date were projected to be \$126,000, whereas we received \$128,000 as of the end of March. In terms of pledge receipts, we budgeted to be at \$109,000 YTD but in fact our pledge receipts totaled \$112,000. In addition, we are right on target with unpledged receipts YTD. Pink, indeed.

A little less pink, however, . . . maybe tending to gray (not a good color for flowers) . . . are the receipts for the Per Capita which are lagging by \$1,000 in terms of where we had hoped to be. What we are looking for are some fresh blooms in terms of receiving \$32 for each confirmed member of Wayside directed towards the Per Capita challenge. Let's make a lovely bouquet of Per Capita contributions this month and put that gray behind us.

In terms of expenses, are we "in the pink"? Yes, we are. We budgeted for expenditures of \$151,000 YTD but look at this: we spent \$139,000, which gives us a savings of \$12,000. We'd call that a rosy picture but we also expect those expenses to return to normal once we are fully open.

So where does this put us with overall revenues versus expenses YTD? We projected we would be at a deficit of (\$25,000) but we actually sit at (\$6,000). Last month we told you that we were still in the black overall and this month's report shows that we are no longer on the positive side of the ledger. A big HOWEVER is that we are doing better than our projected deficit budget, and if we can keep it at that level, we will end up the year "smelling like roses," of the pink variety. Amen to that.

GENEROSITY THOUGHTS

Each year the Generosity Committee chooses a Scripture passage to guide Wayside in its witness to living a life of generous giving of our time, talent and treasure. In 2020 we faced the unknown fears of COVID-19 and chose to focus on Romans 12: 12-13: "Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer. Share with those in need."

This year, as we begin, hopefully, to emerge from the worst of the pandemic, we have chosen two Scripture passages which we pray will speak to all of us in 2021:

".... a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance..." (Ecclesiastes 3:4)

"Be joyful always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18)

We have indeed been in a time of weeping and mourning, as well living in days where we can laugh and dance. For all of these moments we are encouraged to be joyful, to continue to pray and to give thanks to God through Christ Jesus who has been, is now, and will be forever with us. May we lead lives of generosity as a grateful response to God's sustaining love through all time.

3. Mail your check into the church office.
4. Visit www.wayside-erie.org/giving and complete the secure giving form.
5. Scan the QR code to be taken to Wayside's giving site.
6. Download the giving app "Church by Ministry One" from the app store. After installing, open the app and you will be presented with "Find Your Church" in the search box, type Wayside, select the church, and you will then be taken to the church details page. At the bottom of this page click "Select This Church." You should now be presented with the giving page.

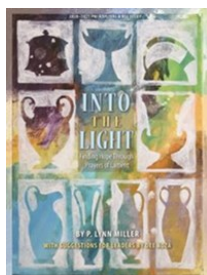
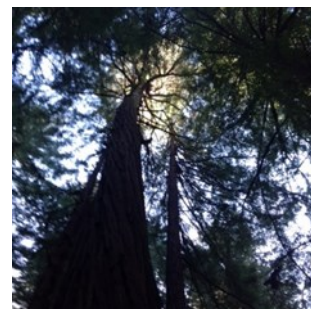
I HAVE NOT LOVED YOU WITH MY WHOLE HEART, MIND AND STRENGTH...

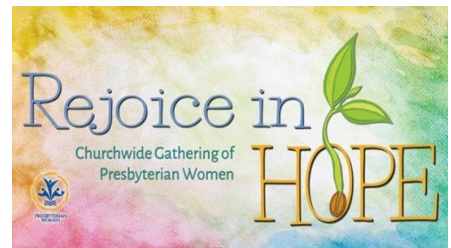
The in-person Churchwide Gathering was cancelled but an online event is being planned for August 4th and 5th.

News from the Unicameral Committee

A Unicameral committee has been formed to evaluate and make a recommendation to combine the Wayside Trustees and Session. Combined boards are very common within our Presbyterian USA denomination and most churches have migrated to a combined board in the last several decades. Within Wayside, the Trustees' primary focus is on the church's physical resources (building, grounds, money, and expenses of running the corporate church). The session's primary focus has been on the mission (outreach, member care, worship, education, etc.). The committee's belief is while all these aspects are critical to the success of the church, it is all in support of Wayside's singular purpose of doing God's work for the church, the community, and the world. Combining the boards will improve our efficiency but more importantly, it will help us corporately focus on our singular purpose of God's work. A combined board will improve our ability for discernment, allowing us to make more immediate decisions with participation individuals representing both the physical resources and mission work of the church. The committee will provide a detailed recommendation to Session (and to the congregation). If approved by session, the recommendation will be presented to the congregation for discussion and approval, which we hope to do sometime in the fall.
