"I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord!" Psalm 122:1

#### A matter for prayer

Finally, the sad present irony of Psalm 122 is how it concludes. "Pray for the peace of Jerusalem: 'May they prosper who love you. Peace be within your walls, and security within your towers.' For the sake of my relatives and friends I will say, 'Peace be within you.' For the sake of the house of the Lord our God, I will seek your good."

Real people are hurt in the struggle for power and justice in the nation of Israel. Advances that have created neighborhoods of Jews and Arabs, both Muslim and Christian, together, are being hurt by political speech and division. There are voices representing extreme positions on both sides, but children and families want peace that is dependable, rooted in equity and justice. Friends, pray for the peace of Jerusalem.

#### Into the Woods...In Wayside's Field



#### An Erie Playhouse Production on Wayside Presbyterian's Property

For so many people and institutions, Covid has been a time of finding creative ways to gather and enjoy the things that bring us together as a community. One of those opportunities was presented to Wayside Presbyterian Church to provide a place for Erie Playhouse to stage its production of Stephen Sondheim's *Into the Woods* in the backfield of our property. After verifying insurance, permits, and that our property could meet the playhouse's needs without interfering with church operations, the staff, Session, and Trustees were excited to be a part of an event that brings together community, the arts, and nature as indoor venues remain limited at best. Letters have been distributed around Wayside so neighbors are aware of the upcoming production.

The play will be held July 9, 10, and 11 (rain dates on the 12th-14th) and 15, 16, and 17 (rain dates on the 18th and 19th); the play will begin at 6:30 and conclude at approximately 8:45pm. Tickets will be on sale (\$25/person) at the Erie Playhouse website (erieplayhouse.org) starting June 7. WaYouth will have a concession stand set up for the 9th-11th evenings to raise money for the 2022 summer mission trip.

#### **BUDGET BYTES from the Budget Committee**

Our monthly reports reflect our budget status from the prior month due to the deadline for newsletter articles. This one is no different, as we now write about where we stood at the end of April. Last month's article presented a "rosy" pink picture for March but what a difference a month has made in terms of feeling "in the pink", so to speak. We will tell you about an April-showery month in terms of revenue and pray that we can paint a drier picture for you next month.

Historically, we get a bump up in pledges after mailing out the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter contribution statements, but not this April. We were \$11k shy of that budget projection. For the month's overall receipts in all categories we had projected receipts of \$46k while receiving \$24k. YTD in the same category we had hoped to receive \$172k but received \$153k, leaving receipts \$19k short for the year. Umbrellas were needed.

Let's move to expenses which continue to be our bright spot in this rainy weather report. In April expenses were only \$2k over budget (had a big bill for one-half of the boiler repair cost) and overall YTD expenses were \$19k under budget projections. As was mentioned last month, however, expect actual expenses to become more in line with projections as the church becomes fully opened.

The overall YTD picture as of April 30 in terms of revenue vs. expenses was this: we projected to be in the red at (\$23k) at the end of April and that was right where we stood. We were told by Karen, our Financial Secretary, that May was going to be an expensive month with these words: "Hold onto your horses, folks, we are in for a ride!"

We end this with an admittedly strained and mixed metaphor but here goes: Let's stop horsing around, rein in our doubts, and if possible, cast away those showers in favor of some sunshiny, generous outpourings of our tithes and offerings. We remain committed to our belief that God's blessings will encourage and sustain us, no matter the weather. Thanks be to God for that...

For your unfailing love for us, and the hope you give,




The new PW Bible Study What My Grandmothers Taught Me: Learning from the Women in Matthew's



#### **ERIE GIVES 2021**

August 10 is this year's date for *Erie Gives*, the Erie Community Foundation's signature event (now in its 11<sup>th</sup> year) to support local charities. Waysiders. let's think about how we will share in this special opportunity to compassionately use our money to spread God's love. (In 2020 Wayside received gifts from 111 generous donors.) The success of *Erie Gives* has grown every year (to date it has raised over \$32.2 million) and we encourage your participation once again.

#### How does Erie Gives work?

- It provides the vehicle for making charitable contributions by posting a list of all the participating charities on its website (<a href="www.eriegives.org">www.eriegives.org</a>). Donations may be made online, by check, or with a gift of stock or required minimum distribution from your IRA. To contribute online visit the Erie Gives website on August 10 from 8 AM to 8 PM. To pay by check see below.
- The charities receive the monies pledged to them and in addition, *Erie Gives* matches a percentage of the monies collected on behalf of each charity and adds it to that charity's total.


