Core Values

In Luke 5, after a frustrating night when he and his partners caught no fish, Simon offers to help Jesus, who needs a platform to speak to the throng of people who are crowding him. Simon takes him just offshore so he can be heard as he teaches the people. After he teaches, Jesus persuades Simon to try fishing again, he says "put out your nets into the deep". Though he is hesitant, Simon puts out his nets into the deep, and what happens is a huge catch; in response to which Simon says, "Go away from me, Lord, I am a sinful man."



Is he? Simon seems like a patient and willing fellow, helping out when he might have preferred to go home. The day turns out to hold a bigger lesson than Simon expected – or wanted. Maybe that is what Simon is admitting. A kind of "thanks, but I am not sure that is what I wanted".

Over the past few months the elders of Wayside have been thinking about the question of "core values" of Wayside. It would seem like that is a simple thing to figure, but it is more elusive than you might think. Core values are both what you hope are true of you but are also those which cause your reach to exceed your grasp – aspirational values. Core values are discerned in response to the questions, who are we and who is Christ calling us to grow to be?

The Session has named Wayside's core values as Welcoming, Compassion, Faithful, and Spiritual Wonder. Here are a few statements that flesh these out. We are <u>welcoming</u> to the gifts and stories and perspectives of others, to the movement of the Holy Spirit in discerning our mission, and to our neighborhood to enjoy our gifts and resources. Our <u>compassion</u> helps us to see the image of God in every person, drives us to seek out new opportunities to serve, and creates an environment where people know they are cared for. Because we are <u>faithful</u> we will strive for reconciliation with one another, seek our God's guidance and strength, and will seek and thank God in worship, prayer and song. Driven by <u>spiritual wonder</u> we are better listeners to each other's stories, struggles and perspectives, we wish to better understand and know our neighbors and God, and we hope to deepen our relationship with Jesus Christ. These are core values for us as a church, and values we hope to engender and deepen and grow.

After more than 20 years as music director and organist at Wayside, Dawn Weborg has announced her retirement June 6 of this year. Her contributions and roles as director, musician, organist, accompanist, teacher, are so many they cannot begin to be listed here. At a time to be announced later this spring there will be a celebration of Dawn's good work. There will be opportunities for everyone to express their appreciation for Dawn and to recount memories and music. We are grateful for Dawn and give thanks to God for her ministry of music at Wayside.

Members for a Music Director Search Committee are being sought and will be appointed by session. Updates about their work will be made as this process progresses.

Technology in the Sanctuary

Coming in the next weeks are long awaited audio and visual technologies in the sanctuary at Wayside. Video monitors will be installed at the front to enhance worship and to work with the architecture of our worship space. The beautiful and artistic things that have been enabled with online worship over the past two years will be brought to in-person worship. There will be new things to learn and include. The sound system will be upgraded to finally solve some of the "dead space" sound issues and overcome the lapel mike lapses. We are grateful to those who have given gifts to fund these upgrades over the past few years.

BUDGET BYTES from the Budget Committee

There is Dickens' "A Tale of Two Cities" and then there is "A Tale of Two Wayside 2021 Budget Outcomes" and the following is our story of two outcomes, both of which are true. Read on.

The first story begins in early 2021 with a projected deficit of (\$50k) and ends with a deficit of (\$23k) which actually is an amazing finish to a second year of pandemic living, partially due to the very generous response to our year-end request for gifts. Pledged giving finished just (\$10k) shy of its goal and we share this quote from Karen, our financial secretary: "I don't think I've ever seen our pledges paid in full or close to it like it shows in this report. It definitely shows the commitment to Wayside." In addition, unpledged giving surpassed its target by \$23k. This story also includes a total savings of \$20k in expenses for 2021, giving us an inspiring ending, albeit a red ending, to a tale that began with many worrisome concerns.

The second budget story (and the one that goes into the financial books) begins with the same projected deficit of (\$50k), continues with the same elements of the first story but ends with a surplus of \$48k (yes, you read that correctly), due to the once-in-a-lifetime influx of \$71,200 in PPP money from the federal government. We are grateful for this gift which rescued us and helped to shore up our fund balance after many years of withdrawals from that reserve due to multiple year-end deficits. However, this story is more of a fairy tale, even while true, because the ending surplus was not of our doing and its cause probably, hopefully, will never need to be repeated in our lifetime. We thank God for the blessing of this additional money but it was just that... a gift that had nothing to do with our own efforts, other than the diligent work performed by staff to obtain those funds for us. The challenge going forward is to understand that it is up to us, all of us, to meet the new deficit realities of 2022 and to dedicate ourselves to this task.

So, what is the overarching moral of this tale of two budget outcomes? God is good, our congregation and staff are steadfast in their support of our ministry and mission, and, with God's guidance, we are the authors who will continue to write the ongoing true story of Wayside Church. The End.




CIRCLE NEWS
