"The wolf shall live with the Lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion and the fatling together, and a little child shall lead them." Isaiah 11:6

Isaiah's vision of the peaceable kingdom sets a tone for the expectation of the messiah. This "upside down kingdom" is a delightful description of God's up-turn of the norms of the world. Isaiah tells of a day when the voracious predator willingly lies down with the vulnerable prey and no one is aggressive or afraid because the world has changed, and God's values of life and worth are on the rise.

The resurrection of Jesus is God's up-turn of the norms – when death no longer holds us in fear, nor motivates us to live selfishly, but openly and generously. We belong to Christ whose promise is a life that overcomes death, and in whom we live a new creation every day. In a world where the threat of death is ever present and often repeated by those who deal in fear or who have something to sell, Christ sets us free to live gratefully, joyfully and triumphantly.

The light that shines from our sisters and brothers who live with resurrection-shaped faith enlightens us – and we become, as we bear our own hope-filled light, a sign to others and to our world that God is free from the norms of the world, and so are we, and, we can say clearly to others – "And so are you!"

Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed! Alleluia!


BAKERS NEEDED!

For many years Wayside has supported the efforts of the Emmaus Soup Kitchen by supplying desserts in months that have five Mondays. The Soup Kitchen was closed during the pandemic but opened again in 2021. At that time we were asked to resume our support. A group of 20 Waysiders provided desserts for the clients of the Soup Kitchen four times last year, during months that had five Mondays. As we resume our efforts in 2022, several of our faithful bakers are no longer able to continue working on this project, so we are looking for people who would like to participate in this project in 2022.

How does this work? During months when there are five Mondays, you would receive an e-mail about a week before the desserts are needed. You can bake anything....cakes, pies, cookies, brownies, etc...and we ask that you provide at least 24 servings. Desserts can be delivered to the church during the week before the fifth Monday and placed in the freezer in the church kitchen, or brought to the church on Sunday morning the day before the fifth Monday, or you can drop your dessert off on the fifth Monday and leave it in the kitchen. In 2022 there are 4 months we will be baking....January (which we have already done), May 30th, August 29th, and October 31st. Desserts are delivered on Monday afternoon so all desserts need to be at the church by noon on Monday.

As you can see this is a very easy project to participate in and requires limited time commitment! If you are interested in joining our faithful bakers this year please contact Lois May at rg_ld_may@verizon.net or call her at 814-490-9426.

BUDGET BYTES from the Budget Committee

The February financial report was "sweet", as was that sugary Valentine month. We received \$8k more in pledges than projected, and aside from interest and per capita receipts, we have exceeded our year-to-date overall revenue goals by \$8k. We have the temporary luxury of knowing that we have received some of what was pledged slightly before they were anticipated and that's a good feeling.

Expenses in February were underspent by \$1k and YTD we are \$3k under budget in that category. Heat and electric expenses are running \$1k over the prior two years; fortunately, that was anticipated during the budget process, but it still remains a concern.

Receipts over expenses YTD were projected to be \$9k but happily sit at \$20k and for this we say "Sweet!" However, we must add a big "BUT" to the equation. This report is merely a snapshot in time because, barring a major influx of revenues, we still are faced with a deficit budget of (\$64,000). May God be with us as we seek to address that not-so-sweet pill.




