In the book of 1 Kings the prophet Elijah arrives during the reign of King Ahab. Ahab and his wife Jezebel were not philosophically, nor theologically, inclined to seek the good of everyone according to the covenant that was understood between the people and God and one another. Elijah could not "go along to get

along" so he spoke up and stood up though it did not earn him a lot of friends. He eventually was under threat for having lived out his convictions.

I think we have the idea that living out one's convictions in a hostile environment is its own reward – that we can lie down in peace because our conscience is clear. Elijah did not have such ease. He said what he had to and lived out his truth; and he was afraid and upset. But, he could not do otherwise. The bad things that were resulting from the bad direction of Ahab and Jezebel required speech that contrasted with them; words that reminded, and named, and described the better way meant for the good of all. Elijah felt like he was all alone. In answer to his lament God assures Elijah that even though he felt alone, there were others who needed and longed to hear his voice, whose hearts were inclined like his.

In his great commentary on this passage John Calvin, who lived 500 years ago, teaches that it is often like this, in the church and in our human societies and in our forms of government, where people of good conscience feel they are all alone. Calvin had the perspective of the centuries before him and his voice speaks to us now, across all that has transpired in the 5 centuries since he lived. Perhaps there are days when we must prayerfully plumb our depths to discern what is true and what is right and what is just. Like Elijah, we may feel, when we speak up, or write the letter, or cast the ballot, that we are the only one. Scripture assures us, there is hunger in many hearts for the light of compassion and the pursuit of what is true so that we may advance toward what is highest and best. We are not alone.

FROM THE OUTREACH COMMITTEE

We would like to thank all the Wayside congregation members who routinely give to special offerings in the church that support our community and global faith-based ministries...you always come through and we love you for it! Here are some of the highlights of the most recent charitable giving events:

- Easter Dinners \$1760 was raised for a special offering to the West Millcreek Food Pantry for Easter Dinners in the community. Without this funding, dinners would not have been possible, and our extra contributions made a major impact offsetting rising food prices.
- Ukraine Relief Offering a total of \$3020 was donated to the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance relief efforts from Wayside. Lake Erie Presbytery collected a total of \$20,166 and this total was matched by the Synod and sent overseas.
- One Great Hour of Sharing Total contributions to this Presbyterian Church Special Offering totaled \$3435 so far. There is still time to contribute, and we thank you all again for supporting this annual offering.

The Session wishes to thank all the Waysiders who have responded to our request for additional financial help to lower this year's (\$64,000) deficit budget with an increased 2022 pledge and/or a special donation. As of May 4, the value of these gifts totaled \$20,408. We are heartened by your generous response!

We just want to give you a heads up that Wayside will again be participating in Erie Gives (Tuesday, August 9), the Erie Community Foundation's very successful signature event to promote giving to local nonprofits, now in its 12th year. Wayside will also continue the practice of encouraging you to contribute to at least two other nonprofits when you donate to Wayside, thus calling our version "Erie Gives +2". In addition, as before, 25% of the matching funds we receive from the ECF will be specifically earmarked for mission projects within the community. It's a win-win, for Wayside and for Erie!

BUDGET BYTES

from the Budget/Finance Committee

After reviewing all the information prepared for us by Karen Pastewka, Financial Secretary, we are once more pleased to report that, as of April 30, all systems were moving "full steam ahead", to borrow from that often-used expression. We exceeded our projected total revenue in April by \$16,000 and year-to-date by \$27,000 and it is looking like we are heading towards a pre-pandemic giving pattern at Wayside.

In addition to pledged and unpledged giving, part of that increase was due to the positive response to Session's "second ask" for help with the deficit reduction, of which \$6,000 has already been received of the \$20,000 raised. We are most grateful for the generosity of Waysiders. This brings our deficit from (\$64,000) to (\$44,000), but as you can see, we must continue to whittle away at that number.

In terms of expenses, while we remain under budget, our spending also seems to be returning to a prepandemic pattern, as well, but actually, that can be taken as a good sign because it means that Wayside activities are once again on the upswing. YTD we are underspent by \$7,000.

Overall revenue/expense YTD was projected to be (\$30,000) yet we remained in the BLACK at \$6,000 as of April 30. Our prayers are for this positive trend to keep moving (here we go again) "full steam ahead".
