Grace and peace to you all in everything.





BUDGET BYTES

from the Budget/Finance Committee


We are thinking that it's summertime and you are wanting to slow down, sit on your back porch or on a lounge chair at the beach, and just chill for a bit. We want you to know where we stand financially but we aim to do it quickly and then have you move on to happy July pursuits.

As of the end of May, we had projected total revenues of \$177,000 and we received \$207,000, putting us \$30,000 ahead of budget. We had expected to have expenses of \$231,000 and have spent \$221,000 (but still have \$3,000 outstanding for the 1st quarter Session Designated Giving). This gives us a savings of \$7,000 on the expense side.

Year-to-date status of Revenues/Expenses at the end of May: we projected to be at (\$54,000) but find ourselves at (\$15,000). **However, we still project a year-end deficit of (\$42,000)** which is down from the original projection of (\$64,000), thanks to the generous response to Session's "Second Ask". Hopefully, our participation in Erie Gives +2 will give us an additional boost.

That's it. Back to a great Erie summer!

PER CAPITA UPDATE

Wayside members keep continuing to send in their Per Capita contribution and May was an especially successful month (\$1,093 came in...no more Per Capita procrastinating for those folks!). How nice it was to type that sentence. Thanks to many Waysiders, we have now raised \$4,430, with high hopes of collecting at least \$7,000 of the \$16,665 that is Wayside's share assessed by the PCUSA to support Presbyterian efforts on the national, synod and Presbytery levels.

Our own Lake Erie Presbytery Executive Director, Anita Bernhardt, (hmm...that name has a familiar ring), is exceedingly grateful for the response from local churches since the majority of the Per Capita money stays locally. We will also be exceedingly grateful if each Wayside family pays its share (\$33 for each confirmed member). Check out our progress chart in the church lobby and be a part of that upward movement towards our goal.
