Let this season of ending one year and planning for the year ahead be one thankfulness, with an enthusiastic conviction that Wayside's life and mission are worthy of our generous and intentional giving.

Please join us this morning in thankful celebration for all God's blessings and for our commitment to the future of this ministry. Your pledge of financial support for 2023 will be gratefully received at both services.



A couple of times a year our local public radio station conducts efforts to encourage members to contribute to fund the programs it broadcasts. As 'consumers of their product', Anita and I do our part. They call us "sustaining members".

Each year Wayside asks members and friends to make a pledge of financial support for the church's work and mission. This is something different from the 'consuming of a product'. It is an interesting consideration, since my compensation is a budget line item; so, what do I do? Anita and I support Wayside, and we try to do so generously. We do it because we believe in the church, and Wayside in particular, as a great expression of who Christ hopes Christians will be in the world. The church is a center to which we return and from which we go to worship and learn and live out love for each other and for the neighborhood, the communities of which we are a part, and for the world we inhabit. I believe it makes a difference that we are here for each other. I believe it makes a difference to each of us when we hear, in a message or prayer, or in a hymn, or from one of our friends, a word that comforts and reassures us, and maybe confirms and challenges. I believe that the regular rhythm of the Christian life of worship, service and growth makes a difference to the world in ways beyond words and doctrines, but in the way people are as fellow travelers in this human journey. I believe this congregation at Wayside is a beautiful expression of God's realm that makes a difference in the world around. This is why Anita and I support Wayside.

Almost every church will tell you that since the suspension of worship during the pandemic the numbers of people in worship have not returned to the place they were before the pandemic. There are many suggestions about why this is so. In case safety is an issue, during the pandemic the building committee at Wayside, with Session's support, saw to it that every room in the buildings had an air purifying system installed. Know that plenty of members, who feel vulnerable or who have been around others who were sick, wear a mask to worship, and masks and hand sanitizer remain readily available. I know this is a personal decision but if you have not returned to worship, know that you are greatly missed, and you and your presence here make Wayside more completely who the church is.

The October meeting of the congregation and corporation is October 9 at 9:30 AM in the church fellowship hall with breakfast beginning at 9:15. This meeting is called by session to elect elders and deacons to their respective boards for the class of 2025, and members at large to the nominating committee. Many thanks to the current nominating committee for the diligent and prayerful work, to those finishing their terms in December, and all those who have answered the call and have agreed to serve.

ERIE GIVES A SUCCESS FOR THE COMMUNITY & FOR WAYSIDE

As was reported in the September newsletter, *Erie Gives* again received tremendous support from the Erie community, topping last year's total, as it has for the past 12 years in a row (final tally of \$8,178,207 from 11,234 donors). Ninety Waysiders contributed to the success of this annual fundraiser sponsored by The Erie Community Foundation, both in terms of the gifts you gave to benefit Wayside's ministry and mission efforts, as well as your support through your donations to other local nonprofits (our +2 concept).

We received a check from *Erie Gives* for \$161,240 which included \$7,757 in matching funds. 25% of those matching funds (\$1,939) will be returned to the community via our mission allocations, as determined by the Outreach Committee. Because of your gifts we are also able to help other ministries in our community with previously-budgeted Session-designated mission funds, as well as other Wayside mission activities, made possible by your generosity. Thank you notes have been sent from Session to all the corporate sponsors who played a vital role in this event. Thanks to all Waysiders who were able to generously support *Erie Gives* in 2022.



BUDGET BYTES from the Budget/Finance Committee

Thanks mostly to Wayside's response to *Erie Gives* (see report above), we have the pleasure of presenting you with a very unexpectedly positive picture of where we stood, as of the end of August. \$94,000 had been projected to be received in pledges but what came in was \$114,000! \$23,000 was expected in unpledged contributions whereas we received \$35,000! Total receipts year-to-date were projected to be \$352,000 but we are here to tell you that the actual receipts totaled \$416,000, giving us a healthy cushion of almost \$64,000 ahead of projections! Please excuse the plethora of exclamation points, normally a non in good writing, but the news was too good to hold back on the enthusiasm.

Where were we on the expense side at the end of August? SNE (Spiritual Nurture & Education), WMFA (Worship, Music & Fine Arts), CDN (Congregational Development & Nurture), and Deacons were underspent for the year by \$4,000. Office expenses were basically as projected. While building expenses were \$3,000 under budget YTD, that figure will probably not hold due to increased electricity costs (57% higher than last year and 124% higher than the year before) and necessary plumbing expenses to address a problem in the ladies' restroom. Overall expenses, however, showed a savings of \$17,000 of which \$14,000 is expected to be a permanent savings at year's end.

Now for the best part: for overall revenues vs. expenses YTD we expected to be at a negative (\$15,000). However, thanks again to Wayside's support of *Erie Gives*, we sit at a positive \$66,000!!! We think that's worthy of three exclamation points, don't you? We conclude with a heartfelt, "Thanks be to God" for the generosity of Waysiders that has enabled our ministry for this church to be on solid ground for the time being. To be sure, we have the remaining three months of the year yet to monitor. Unanticipated expenses or unfulfilled revenues may yet arise but for now we are grateful and pray that this positive financial status will remain through the conclusion of 2022.


