

GENEROSITY THOUGHTS

"Each should use whatever gift one has received to serve others." 1 Peter 4:10



As December begins, we look forward to the traditional season of gift-giving, while at the same time we look back at an equally special year of gift-getting. We are thankful for the many generous gifts of time, talent and treasure offered at Wayside throughout the year which we have highlighted in past "Generosity Thoughts". We would like to add a few more to that list as 2022 draws to a close.

For many years Alice Edwards has offered and continues to offer her talent in finding wonderful speakers for the Adult Issues of Faith class on Sunday mornings. These speakers have enriched our understanding of the world beyond our doors and we are thankful for Alice's generous willingness to serve the church in this capacity.

The Deacons serve the church in many visible and caring ways, such as taking fresh bread to visitors who worship with us for the first time. They also provide a mostly unseen service by delivering a yellow rose on the anniversary of a loved one's death to the surviving family. Presbyterian Women also remember a close relative who has passed during the year by delivering a poinsettia in December, under the direction of Nancy Fye and Karen Haas.

We would also like to acknowledge the generosity shown by so many Waysiders who have made a financial pledge to the church for its mission and ministry in 2023. In this upcoming season of gift-giving, we are blessed by their gift of support.

We are thankful for all of these blessings (and for so many more), the blessings of gift-getting and gift-giving. Thanks be to God.

BUDGET BYTES from the Budget/Finance Committee

Oh, it's going to be a nail-biter....do we end up in the black or in the red at the end of 2022? We have been exceedingly gratified that year-to-date receipts of \$459,000 have greatly outpaced original budget projections of \$406,000 and therefore, as of the end of October we had a cushion of \$53,000. The generosity of Waysiders is a blessing to behold.

There is a "however" to be noted: October did not produce the projected revenue in pledged and unpledged giving, resulting in an unexpected shortfall of \$13,500 in receipts. Typically, October, November, and December show higher receipts than other months, and so we are being cautious in our predictions since October did not follow the typical pattern. If November and December return true to form, (budgeted revenues of \$35,000 and \$43,000), we should end the year in the black by \$7,000. This would be quite a turn-around from a projected deficit of (\$64,000). We are praying for a return to the "true-to-form" pattern.

In expenses we remain under budget projections and should end the year with at least \$15,000 in expense savings. Even with these savings, the work produced by the staff and the committees has been very fruitful. When committees do spend all their budgeted allotment, they are producing benefits beyond expectations (i.e., CDN's Block Party, the Deacons' monthly lunches for the homeless and all the local nonprofits who receive monies from the Session Designated Giving fund). Prudent management of expenses has not meant a drop in meaningful service.

So, here is what we think: save your nails, trust that God has great plans for Wayside Church, and keep praying for a positive November and December!

While that help is still needed, we have recently received word that our help is also needed in other ways.

Also, there is a need for men and women volunteers to help supervise the men and women who spend the night at the shelter. Bread For the World pushed for the passage of the **Global Malnutrition Prevention and Treatment Act through the annual Offering of Letters.** In April, the House passed the Bill and in September so did the Senate.

"The Senate's passage of the **Global Malnutrition Prevention and Treatment Act** demonstrates our bipartisan commitment to address malnutrition that leads to the suffering of millions of children across the globe," said Senator Coons. "As the world recovers from COVID-19 and deals with escalating military conflicts, this bill will help the U.S. lead by example to improve the health of children, mothers, and families around the world. I am delighted that the Senate passed this bill unanimously and look forward to President Biden swiftly signing this bill into law."
