A few months ago Anita and I went to hear the Avett Brothers in concert at Chautauqua Institute. These brothers and their band play mostly acoustic instruments – guitar and banjo - and sing original songs. I was very pleased that on the night we saw them they sang one of my favorites, "Living of Love."

Here are some great lines from that song:

"Say yes we live uncertainty
And disappointments have to be
And everyday we might be facing more.
And yes we live in desperate times
With fading words and shaking rhymes
There's only one thing here worth hoping for;
With Lucifer beneath you and God above
If either one of them asks you what you're living of
Say love, say for me love."

Last week at Wayside, as we celebrated the commitments to stewardship we make for the coming year, we looked at how our scripture from 1 Peter 4:7-11 began with a caution of living in very troubled times. The writer goes on to encourage life as "good stewards of the manifold grace of God," and to "serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received." The letter instructs us that in troubling times we do not hoard or hide away, we live out grace in the many and creative ways we can. We shine the light of the love of Christ though all else may be dark.

The elders began 2022 with honesty, telling everyone from the start that we were operating with a \$60,000 deficit budget. There was an appeal for those able to increase pledges or give additionally, and many did. Committees curtailed spending, even as we remained faithful to our mission partners locally and through the PCUSA. Those who pledged kept up to date with their giving. Others gave generously and regularly. Erie Gives day was another amazing day of generosity for Wayside, and for other non-profits; thank you, all who used that day as a chance to spread your kindness. Month after month this year, Wayside's finances have remained solid, and even though the deficit remains on the books, the giving has stayed ahead. The hope is that when the year ends, the deficit may be overtaken by giving.

The Avett Brothers' song and the First Letter of Peter both tell us of the power of love to steady us, and to steady our world, as we traverse very troubled waters. Wayside is just one church over here in our neighborhood, but what goes on here and the messages we share near and far in our words and deeds is one more light of the love of Christ shining in what often seems like dark times. Take encouragement from these things, and know that your sisters and brothers in Christ are choosing love, and that we are all encouraged and strengthened by knowing that you are choosing love, too. Let us go into these coming months together in the confidence of Christ, and the faith, hope, and love he has brought us and the world.

## BUDGET BYTES from the Budget/Finance Committee

Since August was such a big month in terms of receipts, September had big shoes to fill and wonder of wonders, our overall (shoe) goals were achieved. Pledge receipts were slightly down but unpledged receipts more than made up that shortfall and other income items kept chugging along. Per Capita continues to steadily surpass its original goal expectations as it seeks to approach the success of earlier years. Building rental was only slightly under projections (by \$500) but after losing ½ of the IU rental money (they are using only ½ of their prior space), other new sources of rental just about covered that loss in IU rental income. Year-to-date we continued with the good reporting from August with a September cushion of \$65,000 (projected receipts were \$371,000 with an actual of \$436,000). Filled shoes, indeed.

On the expense side of the equation, the following committees were underspent: Spiritual Nurture & Development, Worship Music & Fine Arts, Congregational Development & Nurture, and Deacons. Office and Building expenses are right on target, even with extremely high electric costs compared to prior years; a recent change in supplier may improve costs in that area. Salary expenses remained down roughly \$10,000 for the year. Year-to-date we showed a total expense savings of \$20,000 as of the end of September. More August shoes filled.

Overall YTD we had projected to be in the red at (\$40,000) and yet we sat at almost \$45,000 in the black at the end of September. As we stated in August's report, we rejoice in this state of affairs but continue to add the caveat that these figures will only hold true if our projected goals for October-December are achieved. So, it's on to see whether September's super shoe-filling continues with a solid October. Thanks be to God for our current good fortune.

As this is being written, two kinds of counting are going on at Wayside: (1) Karen Rae, our Financial Secretary, is counting the number of 2023 pledge commitment cards received, along with the combined financial value of those commitments; and (2) the Generosity Committee is counting on receiving the remainder of the outstanding pledge cards soon so that their phase of operations in this effort can be turned over to the Budget/Finance Committee and its work to develop the 2023 budget.

In addition, we plan to announce and celebrate the results of the 2023 Financial Commitment Campaign with a luncheon on Sunday November 13 after the 11:00 service. All are welcome to join CDN and Generosity for a time of fellowship and celebration of our faith in the ongoing mission and ministry of Wayside.

#### WINTER OUTREACH

Winter is approaching and once again, Wayside will be helping out at Our Neighbor's Place Overflow Shelter, which is located at First Church of the Covenant for one week each month from November through March. In past years our participation at the shelter was limited to providing meals for homeless men and women in downtown Erie. While that help is still needed, we have recently received word that our help is also needed in other ways.

Below is a list of items that are often needed by people who come to the shelter. We are asking that Wayside members consider buying one or more of these items. Beginning November 1, there will be a box located in the church lobby where you can place the items you have purchased. They will be taken to Covenant and distributed to those in need during the cold winter season.

- →Winter gloves heavy weight please. Think about spending your days outside all winter!


