In 2022 the elders of session spent a few months thinking and praying to discern and name what they believed were "core values" of Wayside. You would think that is an easy task. What we found is that we wanted to name experiences and practices, examples of things we value, but focusing onto what is at the heart of those things was challenging. When I name my core

values, and when Anita and I together name our core values, it takes some effort and patience to actually get there.

The elders named these four core values of our life together at Wayside: Welcome, Compassion, Faithfulness, and Wonder. Over the next four months I am going to briefly explore each of those values. Since February bridges the seasons of Epiphany and Lent, linking the wonder of Christmas to the introspection leading to Easter, I am going to start this month with Wonder.

Psalm 8 is a hymn of wonder. "O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth! When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and stars that you have established, what are human beings that you are mindful of them, mortals that you care for them?" Since we live in an era shaped by the discoveries made possible by science, the psalm writer's wonder is expanded with the Hubbell and Webb telescopes that allow us to look with great detail into the depths of the universe, and with microscope technology to look into the tiniest constructions within life on earth. Then, as we grow in awareness of the promise and failings of human endeavors, that poet's question echoes – what are human beings that you are mindful of them? We wonder. In our wonder we may expand our hearts and deepen our trust in the Creator and Redeemer who sustains us that we may ever more reflect the mind of Jesus Christ. Then may we grow more deeply and expansively within, and grow more broadly and expansively beyond ourselves. Wonder is that value with which we encounter mystery and engage curiosity to endeavor life in communion with the One who made us.

Let me invite you to engage in a practice of wonder. The late Father Thomas Keating brought to contemporary light the ancient practice of Centering Prayer. Find a sign-up sheet in the lobby or contact Jennifer at Wayside to indicate your interest in learning about this way of prayer.

May we be inspired by children who see things with new eyes and new perspectives, and honor the clarity of their questions and the natural hope God puts within them. May our sense of wonder be restored that we may be open to all that God is doing in the light of Christ. That we may become, as Jesus advised, like little children.

BUDGET BYTES from the Budget/Finance Committee

In this February issue of the newsletter, the month of love and hearts, we are happy to report that great heart was shown by Waysiders in December to finish 2022 on a most gratifying note. You may recall that we were hoping for December revenues to come in on target, after October and November were painfully shy of projections. Thanks be to God, we did it! We projected revenues of \$43,000 and received \$45,000, with a year-end result of bringing in an astounding \$41,000 over budget, thanks to increased 2022 pledges, one-time gifts, and giving a little extra here and there. Coupled with a savings of \$17,000 in expenses YTD, we ended the year only (\$6,000) under budget, having begun the year projecting a deficit of (\$64,000). Great heart, indeed.

Challenges lie ahead in 2023, as we are beginning again with a projected deficit (\$41,000). Some expenses that we need to carefully monitor are utilities, snow removal, building repair and maintenance, as those have the potential to give us unwelcome surprises. However, we believe that Waysiders will once again show great heart to support this church which we dearly love as she carries out Christ's mission in our community and beyond. Below is the result of the Fall Financial Commitment Challenge for 2023 pledges, compared with 2022, and you will already see a substantial increase in dollars pledged. We again extend heartfelt gratitude to all who made a pledge and we pray for additional support in 2023.


