

In 2022 the elders of session spent a few months thinking and praying to discern and name what they believed were "core values" of Wayside. The elders named these four core values of our life together as Wayside: Welcome, Compassion, Faithfulness, and Wonder. Last month I briefly explored "wonder." This month, as we enter into the season of Lent, and

spend time deepening our awareness of the faithfulness of Jesus, I think it is good to look briefly at "faithfulness."

In Paul's letter to the Galatians is this verse: "We know that a person is justified not by the works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ. And we have come to believe in Christ Jesus, so that we might be justified by faith in Christ, and not by doing the works of the law, because no one will be justified by the works of the law" (2:16). An interesting quirk of the original language permits two different translations of these verses, either "through faith in Jesus Christ" or "through the faith of Jesus Christ" and "justified by faith in Christ" or "justified by the faith of Jesus Christ." That may sound like splitting hairs but it is interesting to consider the location of the faithfulness considered.

As we make our way through the 40 days of Lent and to Holy Week and the cross, Jesus' faithfulness to God's righteousness and to his own sense of calling sets right all that is broken and off-kilter in this world. We keep going back to his teaching that reveals God's realm, and his compassionate acts of mercy, and his staying the course when he is confronted and threatened. Jesus shows what faithfulness is all about.

We are never going to be able to be as faithful to him as he is to God. We keep striving, though. This means we have opportunity every day to be faithful in the ways we live in the world and interact with other people. We are faithful even as we may fall short. We are faithful in how we trust in the forgiving and unfailing love of God in Jesus Christ—as we have faith in the faithfulness of God.


We make our way into the season of Lent and we will follow a theme we are adapting from a team of theologians and ministers called A Sanctified Art. The theme is called "Seeking: Honest Questions for Deeper Faith." You can find the card packets for devotional use in the sanctuary narthex or by asking me or Nathan. They follow the theme closely. Here are the gospel readings and the question for each week:

First Sunday in Lent	February 26	Matthew 4:1-11	Who will you listen to?
Second Sunday in Lent	March 5	John 3:1-17	How do we begin again?
Third Sunday in Lent	March 12	John 4:5-42	Will you give me a drink?
Fourth Sunday in Lent	March 19	John 9:1-7	Who sinned?
Fifth Sunday in Lent	March 26	John 11:1-45	Can these bones live?
Palm Sunday	April 2	Matthew 21:1-11	Where are you headed?
Maundy Thursday	April 6	John 13:1-17,31-35	Will you wash my feet?
Good Friday	April 7	Matthew 27:27-50	Why have you forsaken me?
Easter Sunday	April 9	John 20:1-18	Who are you looking for?

There are studies you can join in (Mindful Parenting; The Sermon on the Mount)— if you cannot make all the sessions make what you can. Try Centering Prayer, a way of prayer you can practice on your own and meet up online once a week if you wish. And there is always a place in the Sunday morning Issues of Faith Class— where "honest questions for deeper faith" are always being asked and explored.

Jesus is faithful. He calls to us to walk our path of faithfulness—and it is core and key to who we are as God's people in this time and place. Let us journey that path together.

# BUDGET BYTES from the Budget/Finance Committee

On the day this is being written the sun is brightly shining (unusual for this time of year, to say the least) and maybe that accounts for the mostly optimistic view we have about the January start to our budget year. True, we are beginning the year with a projected (\$41,000) deficit .... but that's down from our 2022 budget deficit of (\$64,000), so isn't that worthy of a glass-half-full shout out? We nearly eliminated the deficit last year, so we believe that Waysiders can rise again to the challenge in 2023.

January was a healthy receipts month with \$2,000 more coming in from unpledged giving than projected (praise God!), while pledged giving was \$1,000 below projections. That still results in an overall receipts increase of \$1,000, so shine, sun, shine on.

No Erie weather report would be complete without some clouds in the forecast, however, so here is our cloudy side to this account. We thought we had taken into account the huge projected increases in gas, electric and snow removal but collectively January saw a total overage in those three areas alone of \$3,800. (That was more than just "cloudy", we must say.) Overall total expenses were only (\$800) over projections, however, and since receipts were \$1,000 to the good, we ended the month just about where we were projected to be.

Sunshine or not, our God is with us on this journey and we will continue to believe in the generosity of Waysiders to see us through. Amen and amen.



# Ongoing Wayside Giving Options

We'd just like to remind you of available ways to simplify your giving. Whether you prefer to write your checks, have them set up on a re-occurring basis, or would like fast access, there is an option for you.

- 1. Set up direct bill pay with your financial institution (see your online banking platform for details or call your bank).
- 2. Sign up for auto-debit which incurs no charges or bank fees; the form can be found on page 6, return to Wayside.
- 3. Mail your check into the church office.
- 4. Visit <u>www.wayside-erie.org/giving</u> and complete the secure giving form.
- 5. Scan the QR code to be taken to Wayside's giving site.
- 6. Download the giving app "Church by Ministry One" from the app store. After installing, open the app and you will be presented with "Find Your Church" in the search box, type Wayside, select the church, and you will then be taken to the church details page. At the bottom of this page click "Select This Church." You should now be presented with the giving page.
- 7. Send a PayPal payment to <a href="mailto:steward@wayside-erie.org">steward@wayside-erie.org</a>.
- 8. Text the dollar amount you would like to give to 814-247-0003.

## PW sponsors Annual Bread for the World Offering of Letters

Please get ready on **March 12<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> to participate in our annual BFW Offering of Letters**. We will write to our legislators and urge them to support the reauthorization of the farm bill in order to build healthy, equitable, and sustainable food systems. Among the measures that should be included are strengthening nutrition security in domestic and international programs; creating a more equitable SNAP program; and increasing food systems sustainability.

The impact of the farm bill is significant. It not only affects the agriculture and food sectors – it can play a huge role in ending food insecurity and hunger in the U.S. and save the lives of millions of God's children.

Look for tables set up in the church lobby and stop by to pick up and write three letters (Senators Casey and Fetterman and Representative Kelly.) **The most effective letters are ones that include a personal message or story.** There will be space at the bottom of the preprinted letters to share a personal message with your congressmen. Perhaps you will want to share activities we do at Wayside to combat hunger, explain how your faith drives you to work to end hunger or tell a story about why addressing hunger issues is important to you. What you write matters. Your voice has the power to influence efforts and votes. We hope to see you in the lobby on March 12<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>.

Each year PW works to fulfill our purpose: Forgiven and freed by God in Jesus Christ, and empowered by the Holy Spirit, we commit ourselves:

- to NUTURE our faith through prayer and Bible study,
- to SUPPORT the mission of the church worldwide
- to WORK for justice and peace, and
- to **BUILD** an inclusive, caring community of women that strengthens the Presbyterian Church (USA) and witnesses to the promise of God's Kingdom.

One way we do this is by making donations to organizations that we feel helps fulfill our purpose. At our January meeting we agreed to spend \$5,900 as follows:

\$300 to The Ghana Partnership, Daystar Awareness Prison Ministry, Restore Elikia (The mission of Restore Elikia is to provide sustainable orphan support through the provision of clean water, food, education, and medical care in the Democratic Republic of the Congo), and Funds for Armenian relief.

\$400 to The Script Project (The Script Project promotes culturally responsive, anti-racist integrations through programming and training to support marginalized communities in the Erie area.), Relief for Ukraine and the National Council of Resistance of Iran (The National Council of Resistance of Iran (NCRI) represents an enduring democratic political coalition founded in Tehran in July 1981, which has steadfastly sought an end to religious dictatorship and promotes a free and democratic Iran based on its platform.)

\$500 to The Multi-Cultural Resource Center, Vision for the Poor, Mercy Center, Inter- Church Ministries, Erie United Methodist Alliance (Homeless Shelter), Safe-Net, and U.S. Committee for Refugees and Immigrants.

Along with the donations, we sent letters of encouragement to these groups and thanked them for all their efforts! PW will continue throughout the year to be strong supporters of mission projects.




# Wayside "Swag" Design Contest
