Often the invitation to the communion table is from Matthew 11:28-30, "Come to me all you that are weary and carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." This is a word of welcome.



Welcome is another of the four core values of Wayside that the elders discerned, and about which I have been writing: Compassion, Wonder, Faithfulness, and Welcome. "Be

who you are, and be welcome here" is our easily remembered statement of welcome. Thanks be to God! Being welcoming is a value that often seems passive – like holding a door open – which is active but only to a point. Jesus, in the passage from Matthew, is inviting us in, welcoming us, but he is also presenting us with permission to live into our heart's calling and obligation. He promises we will find rest for our souls as we accept the yoke on our shoulders that Christ has, a burden which is easy and light. It is a journey of our lives to discover the unique fit of that yoke upon us. So, the welcome, to be who we are, invites us into fellowship with Jesus with whom we will walk. We will change, and that change will be inward and outward as we learn from Jesus, gently, and in humility. In this way, welcome is both passive, in that we say, "come on in!" and active in that we trust the transforming power of Jesus to shape our lives, the lives of others, and all of us together. Welcome!

Sunday May 28 is Pentecost Sunday and on that day we remember the story of the powerful movement of the Holy Spirit in the church. This year we are receiving a denominational offering for the first time, "the Pentecost Offering" which is for youth ministry across the denomination and right here at home. As we consider the future, we rely upon the work of the Holy Spirit to bring God's changes to our world. I have such confidence and hope in the character and creativity and genius of the coming generations, I want to give generously to an offering that recognizes the Spirit's invitation to all of us, working new vision and power in those upon whose gifts and leadership we depend and hope.

Our summer worship schedule begins June 4 when we transition to a single service Sunday morning at 10 AM. Also, the Technology Committee plans to transition in June from the pre-recorded worship services that we have been posting to social media and emailing out since the beginning of the pandemic three years ago, to the livestreaming of worship on Sunday morning, with services archived for viewing later. This will mean a change for those who have been viewing worship on Saturday night, or early Sunday morning in their pjs. We hope, too, it will be a window into the real events, music, people and celebration of being the church gathered, so that those unable to attend can enjoy those aspects that have been missing from our current format.

May grace and peace abound through Jesus Christ!




WAYSIDE MULTICULTURAL DINER'S CLUB

"Summer Holiday": Knowing Our Story Through Our Celebrations

BUDGET BYTES from the Budget/Finance Committee

The end-of-March financial report, in terms of <u>revenues</u> received, was a gloomy one, much like the Erie March weather it mirrored. We dislike beginning our update this way but we always aim to be open and candid and these numbers need to be shared with you. Total revenue for the month was projected to be at \$34,000 whereas we received \$26,000, leaving us \$8,000 short. Pledged giving was (\$6,000) below March projections, unpledged (\$2,000) and the Per Capita appeal (\$1,000). In terms of year-to-date revenues, we were (\$6,600) below projections. Ouch.

On the good news side, <u>expenses</u> stayed on track for the month and even came in below projections by \$1,000 despite continuing high utility and snow removal costs. YTD expenses were projected to be \$137,000 and that is right where we stood at the end of March.

Overall YTD projections (revenues vs. expenses) were for us to be in the red at (\$6,000); in actual numbers, however, we were in the red at (\$13,000). We are grateful to all those who did contribute their offerings while hoping that March was a one-and-done revenue slide and pray that April will see a return to the normal pattern of generosity so typical of Waysiders. We thank all for your continued support of our important ministry and mission.

Hello, Hello, the Per Capita Appeal Calling.....

Hello, hello....is anybody home? This is your Per Capita Appeal calling since we didn't receive our usual hefty March response from Wayside Church. We are concerned because in March 2022 Waysiders contributed a total of \$1,982 but this year we only received \$738. (In fact, for the past ten years we received an average of \$2,600 in March, so we hope nothing is amiss at your house.) Perhaps you were basking in warmer climates (we don't blame you!) and forgot all about us....but we haven't forgotten about you because we are counting on your support.

In case you don't remember what we are, here it is in a nutshell (or a seashell, if you were in fact on some sunny beach in March):

The Per Capita Appeal (goal of \$6,000) asks that <u>every confirmed member of Wayside will contribute \$33 per head</u> ("capita" in Latin, FYI) to help defray Wayside's yearly obligation to the PCUSA (\$16,302 in 2023).

The funds support the important on-going work of the Presbyterian Church on the national, synod, and presbytery levels and help to keep us connected.

Our local Lake Erie Presbytery receives the bulk of our Per Capita monies (you may recall that our Executive Presbyter is closely related to Pastor James...hint, hint).

We don't wish to be a nuisance but we plan to be diligent in trying to reach you because we know how generous you have been in the past. You can remit your \$33 contribution by check ("per capita" on the memo line, made out to Wayside Church) or via the Wayside online giving portal (see "Per Capita"). We hope to hear from you soon.

Making Miracles Group Home Phase II Group Home Tallahassee, Florida (\$150,000)

Making Miracles Group Home (MMGH) helps young mothers break the cycle of abusive relationships, addiction, incarceration and early motherhood—a repeating pattern that is difficult to break and overcome. Since its inception in 2010, MMGH has served over 100 women and their children by providing a one-year, live-in program designed to support young mothers and help them develop skills to live independently and care for their children. With the Birthday Offering grant, MMGH will purchase a second group home to serve an additional five families who are at risk of experiencing homelessness. With loving support and tools to establish stable, permanent housing, these families can look forward to a hopeful and successful future.


Berhane Yesus Elementary School Kindergarten School Construction Dembi Dollo, Ethiopia (\$99,400)

Berhane Yesus Elementary School, located in the western highlands of Ethiopia, seeks to

change lives by sharing the "Light of Jesus" and by providing the best possible educational experience for the children of Dembi

Dollo. This K-8th grade school has been serving the community and been a part of the Presbyterian Church in this rural community since 1921. Western Wollega Bethel Synod has provided land for a kindergarten classroom and the Birthday Offering grant will provide all necessary funding for its construction.

OUTREACH NEEDS

MCRC provides a variety of educational, social service, child development housing, and employment programs to the Latino, Refugee, Immigrant, and New American populations in Erie in a client-first and focused manner. <u>Sometime in May, MCRC will begin to resettle refugees in Erie.</u> There will be:

- * A Burmese family of 5 coming. A husband and wife with a 7-year-old daughter, 5-year-old son. and 2-year-old daughter.
- A Syrian family of 6 coming. This is a husband and wife with 3 girls (9, 5 & 1.5) and a 7-year-old boy.
- Another Syrian family of 5 coming. This is a husband and wife with 3 daughters (soon to be 15, soon to be 13 and 5).
- A single Congolese gentleman and his brother.



MCRC will be working as a team to get housing set up for these families and is looking for community support to make sure that everything is set up in a welcoming and warm fashion. The following are needed items:

- Queen size beds, twin beds, toddler beds, cribs
- Couches, recliners, desks, chairs, coffee tables
- Televisions, lamps, end tables, bookshelves
