



In June the Revised Common Lectionary has readings from the book of Genesis and the stories of Abraham and Sarah. Those ancient stories tell of a couple who answer God's call when they are no longer young. At a time of life when one would expect people to settle down, this story tells how Abraham and Sarah pick up and leave for an unknown destination. They go trusting in God's promise.



They also go trusting in the promise of a future that seems unlikely. They are no longer young, yet they trust in a vision of descendants "as many as the stars in the sky." They have no children, but they accept names which mean "mother and father of a multitude."

In the church lobby is a yellowed newspaper clipping of a small group of people breaking ground for an as yet to be church, which is Wayside. We envision this place and the sanctuary when we think of Wayside. The promise of God may have to do with buildings and institutions, but we know it is more than that. The promise of God is about lives that are changed when people trust God's call to them; when they trust that God is good; when they seek to live lives for the sake of a better, kinder, more just world.

It is a calling and a challenge for us to imagine how we can live trusting the promises of God in the uses of the buildings and property that are entrusted to us. We can celebrate the five years we were home to the IU5 public school preschool for children. The education of those young ones was something that meshed well with who we are.

Take a look around and see. On Sunday mornings with Sunday School and worship and Wednesday afternoons with WOW, on third Saturday bag lunch prep, and the many ways throughout the year we gather, cook, prepare, serve, study, pray, create, enjoy, and love: look around to see how this place and the people who gather as a congregation are trusting God's promises. As we enter the somewhat slower pace of the summer, take a deep breath, and like Abraham and Sarah, listen, and wonder. Imagine the ways we are being called to respond in faith to God's call now, to trust the promises of God.

### BUDGET BYTES from the Budget/Finance Committee

#### **BUDGET BYTES from the Budget/Finance Committee**

The months seem to fly by ... it seems like we were just giving you March's financial report and here we are writing about April's totals and the year-to-date picture.

**Receipts** in the form of pledges were short of projections by (\$4,750) but better than the (\$7,000) shortfall in March, with YTD leaving us below projections by (\$12,000); we are hopeful that in time that will come around. Unpledged giving is basically right on target. We did have a successful Talent Auction which brought in over \$7,000, split evenly between One Great Hour of Sharing and general fundraising, which added an additional \$3,500 to the receipts column and gave us an overall YTD shortfall in revenues of approximately (\$8,000). Not great but still within reach....glass half full, don't you think?

**Expenses** for April were only about \$250 shy of budget projections (even with heat, electric and snow removal again higher than anticipated) and YTD we are basically right on the mark (only \$100 over budget) due to underspending in some areas (i.e., building and equipment maintenance). We can be thankful that we have a staff that is mindful of staying on track as much as possible, even with the constraints of ever-rising costs.

**Overall YTD revenues vs. expenses** were projected to see us at (\$12,000) whereas we sit at (\$20,000). An uptick in pledged as well as unpledged giving will do the trick to get us back on track, as will continued support of the Per Capita Appeal. We still proclaim a "glass half full" and pray for that glass to be filled to the brim with Wayside generosity in the coming months. Thanks be to God for blessings that flow our way.


#### **SOPHIA CIRCLE**

#### HONORARY LIFE MEMBERSHIP

PW is accepting nominations for honorary life membership. The Honorary Life Membership (HLM) program was established early last century in the Presbyterian Church to honor faithful service to the women's organization and to the church. Recipients become a part of a large group of women (and a few men) who have been recognized in this way. More than a thousand are awarded each year. The Honorary Life Membership is represented by a silver or gold membership pin that is presented along with a personalized certificate. The Honorary Life Member-

ship pin symbolizes values held dear by Presbyterian Women. Funds derived from Honorary Life Membership support the PW Leadership Development Grant Program. Grants from this program enable individuals to engage in leadership development opportunities such as the Churchwide Gathering, Ecumenical Advocacy Days and the UN Commission on the Status of Women. #### CHANGES COMING TO ONLINE WORSHIP


Starting June 4, the online worship Wayside will switch livestreaming. That means the prerecorded service that has been sent out each weekend since March
