Session has approved a plan for an ad hoc committee to consider the best stewardship of Wayside's blessing of a large facility and plenty of land.

"How are we called to manage this legacy in ways that help build God's kingdom both now and five, ten, fifty years on. How do we serve and interact with our immediate neighborhood? From the mundane to the visionary, we collectively have both a responsibility and an opportunity to envision and plan for the future. Prior to Covid, Wayside formed an ad-hoc group to collect ideas for how we could take greater advantage of our facility and land. That effort dissipated as we all reacted to the pandemic. Now is a good time to reconstitute and formalize that effort. Because this effort will touch on every aspect of life here at Wayside, we need to engage as broad a group of Waysiders as possible. Hence this proposal for an ad-hoc, single purpose committee that draws from both existing leadership (Session and existing committees) and the Congregation at large. We may also want to consider adding representatives of the surrounding neighborhood to ensure that those interests are also represented. At a minimum, a part of the committees charge should be to coordinate with and seek input from the surrounding neighborhood as we consider how best to use our facility and land.

Over the years, there have been numerous good, creative ideas for how Wayside could use our facility and grounds, but without a sustained effort to gather, organize, prioritize, and realize those ideas – Wayside is likely to remain in a business-as-usual mode.

The task for the committee would be to develop a comprehensive plan for the building and grounds looking as far into the future as possible. A fundamental piece of this would be to develop a financial blueprint for achieving the broader vision – or at least pieces of it."

BUDGET BYTES from the Budget/Finance Committee

We are halfway through the year, budget-wise, as of June 30. We have been on a roller coaster ride this year, with some months up and some down. June's <u>receipts</u> were \$3,000 short and year-to-date we are running \$7,000 below projections.

Even though pledged and unpledged receipts were under for the month and for the year, we do have a few bright highlights to share. Elsewhere in the newsletter you will read of the success of the Per Capita Appeal (we have reached and even exceeded our year-end budget projection of \$6,000!). Building rental was projected to be at \$7,000 and yet we have received \$8,500; we will take that momentary gain as a welcome sign. Interest income is up and the Talent Auction took in \$4,000, providing both an influx of funds and a fun event for those in attendance.

<u>Expenses</u> are looking good. YTD we are running \$5,000 below projections, thanks to the continuing diligent efforts of our staff and committees, especially Spiritual Nurture and Development, Worship Music and Fine Arts, and Deacons, all of whom are underspent for the year.

Overall, in the area of <u>receipts versus expenses</u>, we are just \$1,000 off budget at the mid-year point. This is an excellent place to be and we still look forward to an influx of cash when the Erie Gives receipts come in August.

However, (we wish that we didn't always have to close the monthly reports with a "however"), we remain in a deficit budget situation (\$41,000). That is what was projected in January and it remains steadfastly lurking in the background, even as we are grateful that we are staying on target with projections for the 2023 budget. Godwilling, we will ride that roller coaster up, up, up for the second half of the year and forget about any downward motion. (Ooh, perhaps that was an awkward stretch of a metaphor, but you get the picture.) Onward and upward, in other words. Amen.

WAYOUTH AND WOW CLUB PROJECT: GARDEN OF EDIN

A project to learn about and serve with a community garden that is contributing to the community life of Edinboro and making significant contributions in the fight against food scarcity.

9:30—Meet at the Garden of Edin Community Garden, 4281 Route 6N Edinboro, PA

9:45-10:30—An overview and history of the garden and its mission will be given along with a quick tour, including harvesting veggies for the Edinboro Food Pantry.

10:30-11:45—Since we will be building compost bins, we will briefly explain what compost is and how it is made, followed by deconstruction of the old compost bins.

Lunch at Sarah Jay's house (1 mile from garden) - Hot dogs, chips, watermelon, drinks, etc. Along with cornhole, KanJam, and Slammo.

1:00-3:00—Build new compost bins.

- Other potential projects: weeding beds and paths, spreading mulch on the paths, and walking the labyrinths
 (with lessons about identifying weeds and labyrinths).
- It is recommended to bring good work gloves and a shovel, but not mandatory as there will be some provided. All other tools will be provided. Drinks will be available at the garden while they're working, probably snacks too.

August 28: Parable of the Sower with Melinda Hall from the Episcopal Cathedral of St. Paul


SOPHIA CIRCLE

HONORARY LIFE MEMBERSHIP

PW is accepting nominations for honorary life membership. The Honorary Life Membership (HLM) program was established early last century in the Presbyterian Church to honor faithful service to the women's organization and to the church. Recipients become a part of a large group of women (and a few men) who have been recognized in this way. More than a thousand are awarded each year. The Honorary Life Membership is represented by a silver or gold membership pin that is presented along with a personalized certificate. The Honorary Life Membership pin symbolizes values

held dear by Presbyterian Women. Funds derived from Honorary Life Membership support the PW Leadership Development Grant Program. Grants from this program enable individuals to engage in leadership development opportunities such as the Churchwide Gathering, Ecumenical Advocacy Days and the UN Commission on the Status of Women.
