## REFUGEE UPDATE

Our refugee family arrived February 2 looking exhausted and a bit scared. The family is Muslim and the mom will wear traditional African clothing with a head covering any time she is outside her home. The older daughter will most likely have her head covered but may wear pants and long sleeves. The parents left Sudan and have been in a refugee camp in Chad for 20 years. All four children were born at the camp and have only known life in a refugee camp. They speak Arabic and no English. Pictures of their airport arrival and their apartment are posted on the PW bulletin board. Please consider donating gently used or new clothing in the sizes below:
